IMPORTANT POLICIES

College Visit Policy

Every junior, during the second semester, and every senior is allowed ONE excused absence to visit a college or university. The procedure is as follows:

- 1) At least two days prior to the scheduled visit, the student must bring a note from their parent to the Attendance Office.
- 2) On the day of the scheduled visit, a parent must contact the Attendance Office at Guerin Prep and notify the school that the student is visiting a college campus.
- 3) Upon returning to school, the student must bring a note to the Attendance Office.

There will be NO excused absences before September 15th or after May 1. The student may not have an excused absence on the day of a scheduled test. All work missed due to the absence must be made up. The procedure must be followed exactly or the absence will not be considered excused.

Transcript Request Policy

Any student who wants a transcript sent to a college must bring the following to the Registrar's Office:

1) A completed Transcript Request/Authorization Form signed by both the student and parent. This Transcript Authorization Form may be obtained from either Ms. Kenning or Ms. Stephany in the Registrar's Office.

2) A stamped envelope with the address of GUERIN PREP. as the return address. (Postage: business envelope = 44 cents)

Transcripts should be sent WITH THE APPLICATION. NO OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT WILL BE GIVEN TO THE STUDENT; IT MUST BE SENT BY THE REGISTRAR DIRECTLY TO THE COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY.

NOTE: For college applications, the first two (2) transcripts are free. Thereafter, a fee of \$5.00 per transcript is charged. For scholarship applications, one transcript may be requested before a fee of \$5.00 will be charged.

COLLEGE TIMELINE

While general in nature, the following timeline is designed to help students and parents prepare for the college search and selection process.

Freshman Year

- ✓ Take challenging classes
- ✓ Become involved in school activities and clubs
- ✓ Get involved in a service project in your community: church, community center, park district, etc.

Sophomore Year

- ✓ Continue to challenge yourself in classes and remain involved in extracurricular activities
- ✓ Talk to the college representatives who visit Guerin Prep

Junior Year

- ✓ Attend a college open house and investigate admission requirements
- ✓ Take the ACT
- ✓ Continue to work hard in classes and stay involved in activities; consider a leadership position in clubs

Senior Year

- ✓ Apply to colleges and be aware of deadlines
- ✓ Complete the FAFSA after January 1
